
iHola! Yo soy la Señora Tirado

Assignments:

All in-class assignments and homework will be calculated into this grade. These practice exercises are to reinforce what has been covered in class. These will include, written activities, workbook activities, homework, and projects.

Final Exam:

The final exam is the summarized evaluation of the content learned throughout the year. Students will be expected to read, write, listen, and speak in Spanish.

Participation:

This grade is given for your overall effort to promote a healthy learning environment. This grade directly deals with how much you use Spanish in the class and are active in class and group activities.

Missed Work
